Online Enrolment User Guide

- Online enrolment is closed 7 days before a course is due to start, even if there are places available, so please call the relevant office to check.
- Only a limited number of places are made available online. If a course appears full please contact the relevant office.
- To search for a course, please only complete one of the search criteria boxes (ideally the Course Reference which starts C23).
- When you book online your details are used to complete an enrolment form that will be pre-printed and available for you to sign at the first session. For this reason each person booking online must have registered separately with the WEA for online enrolment and must also have their own personal email account.
- If you are enrolling for the first time you will need to register as a new user after finding your course and clicking **enrol now**. If you have enrolled previously you will need to sign in by clicking the **sign in** button.
- For help you can email enrolonlinesupport@wea.org.uk or refer to the user guide by clicking **how to enrol** at the bottom of the search screen.
- When registering, a field with a * is mandatory and must be completed.

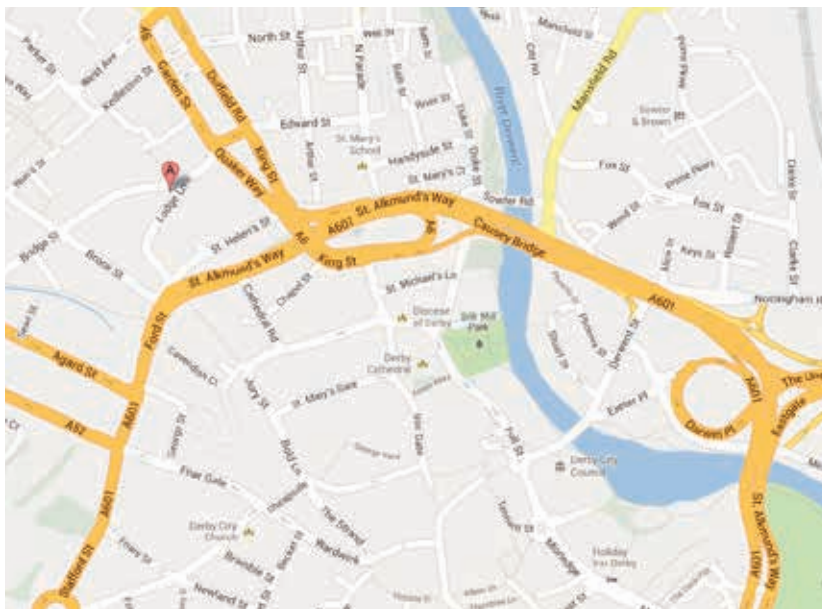

Course fees and financial support

Financial support for course costs

Students on eligible income-related benefits and their dependants may be entitled to have their tuition fees waived or reduced. Not all courses qualify for a fee waiver. There are also some funds available to help with course fees (for those not on income-related benefits) and costs such as childcare or essential books or equipment needed for your course. You will be asked for evidence of financial hardship eg proof of benefit, evidence of low household income or evidence of difficulty balancing income and expenditure. Help is limited to three courses a year.

Discounts for multiple courses

If you are a full fee payer and attend two or more courses during the same term, you can receive a 10% discount on your additional courses. You pay the full fee for your longest course. Please note: if you wish to claim this discount, you will need to book by post.

Course cancellation and refunds

You can cancel a course booking at any time, in writing, by phone or by calling at your local office/branch.

- A full/partial refund will be given to all students where a course is cancelled or shortened by the branch/organiser.
- If you cancel within seven working days of booking and the course hasn't already started, you'll receive a full refund.
- If the course is delivered over more than three sessions, you can cancel before the start of the second session and still receive a refund. There may be an admin charge.

All other refunds will only be considered in exceptional circumstances.

Age eligibility

Students must be 19 or over by 31 August at the start of the current academic year to enrol on a WEA course.

The cost of your course

We receive funding from the Government to subsidise our courses which helps us keep fees as low as possible. As part of this, we need to ask you for your date of birth and how long you've been resident in the UK/EU when you enrol. If you haven't been resident in the UK/EU for the last three years, we'll ask you to complete a Student Eligibility Form and provide appropriate proof. Where information on date of birth or residency is not provided, a higher non-subsidised fee is payable.

Do you need help with your fees?

If you need help with your fees and have a gross annual household income of under £15,276 you may be able to apply for financial help with costs.

1. Full fee
