- Online enrolment is closed 7 days before a course is due to start, even if there are places available, so please call the relevant office to check.
- Only a limited number of places are made available online. If a course appears full please contact the relevant office.
- To search for a course, please only complete one of the search criteria boxes (ideally the Course Reference which starts C23).
- When you book online your details are used to complete an enrolment form that will be pre-printed and available for you to sign at the first session. For this reason each person booking online must have registered separately with the WEA for online enrolment and must also have their own personal email account.
- If you are enrolling for the first time you will need to register as a new user after finding your course and clicking **enrol now**. If you have enrolled previously you will need to sign in by clicking the **sign in** button.
